## PASTOR'S CORNER

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness."

The Right of Life is the first of our self-evident rights. That's why defense of life against abortion, capital punishment, torture, destruction of human embryos for research etc. is a patriotic act. In our pursuit of other rights, there is sometimes a conflict. Maybe a cure for a disease might depend on research involving the destruction of human embryos. That does not mean that one of the rights is denied, rather, it is "out-ranked".

Correspondingly, the defense of life involves respecting the life of every person. No adjective such as "guilty" takes away the right to life. It does not allow us to put retribution ahead of respect for life. In The Gospel of Life Pope John Paul II called for a consistent life ethic. That might very well be the best way to promote Right to Life. On this weekend in which we celebrate freedom, it is important to remember this.
