PASTOR'S CORNER

Last Sunday I attended a birthday celebration for Lucy DeNittis. Let's say that she is more than 89-years-old. There were about 50 people there. Her closest living blood relatives live out west. No one at the party, that I know, was a blood relative. Yet everyone there felt and expressed a great deal of affection for Lucy. It was palpable. It was a joy.

Family is beautiful. So, too, is friendship developed over the years. Any time we celebrate bonds that extend beyond blood, it is a very good thing. Stretching the circle of concern and affection ever wider is part of being a Christian. Jesus was in the habit of calling his disciples "brother, and sister, and mother to me."

Lucy also shared a bit of the history of her journey from Italy to Hamilton. Immigrants, both then and now, seek the same thing: a better life. When Lucy entered the U.S. visas were not required. She did recount her experience with the physical that was required on both sides of the Atlantic. Times have changed for today's immigrants, our sisters and brothers. Visas are almost impossible to obtain, yet our economy depends, in part, on immigrant labor. Certainly their families, back in the country of origin, depend on their remittances. Any time we stretch the bonds of concern and affection ever wider, it is a very Christian thing.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

As we begin reading from the "Bread of Life" passage from John's Gospel it is appropriate to extend an invitation for you to consider becoming an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Some may wonder why the name "Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion". Ordinary ministers are bishops, priests, and deacons. In that sense lay ministers are "extraordinary".

In another sense all ministers of Holy Communion are to be "extraordinary." We are doing far more than just "passing out Communion". We are ministering the Body and Blood of Christ. No matter if we are lay, religious, or ordained, those who minister Holy Communion are to give public witness to the ministry we exercise. The ceremony commissioning extraordinary ministers reminds them:

In this ministry, you must be examples of Christian living in faith and conduct; you must strive to grow in holiness through this sacrament of unity and love. Remember that, though many we are one body because we share the one bread and one cup.

That is understood to include:

- Being regular in attending Sunday Mass
- Being a person of prayer, especially participating in Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament when possible
- Living a life that gives public witness to the ministry. While no one is "worthy", that is understood to mean being in a marriage recognized by the Church and not living in a way that is clearly counter to Church values.
- Being willing, at least on occasion, to minister Holy Communion to sick and shut-ins.

Archdiocesan Trip to Mexico

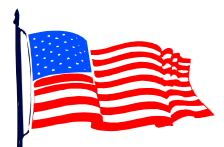
The Mission Office of the Cincinnati Archdiocese occasionally sponsors tours to other countries to enable participants to experience, first-hand, the culture and the spirituality of other countries. One such excursion, coming up in December, will visit Mexico City and the coastal area of Puerto Escondido. This is the diocese of Bishop Eduardo Carmona whom some may remember as having visited with us here at St. Julie's.

Two tour options are available:

- Plan A – December 11-18, will visit Huatulco and Puerto Escondido to share in the celebration of the local religious festivals, and to enjoy the beautiful beaches and tourist sites.
- Plan B – December 8-10, will start in Mexico City to visit the world famous Basilica of Guadalupe and the museums of Anthropology and the Fine Arts, before joining the other tour group in Puerto Escondido.

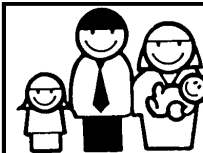
