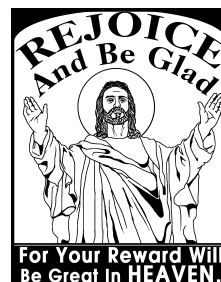


PASTOR'S CORNER

All Saints Day celebrates, among other things, the universal call to holiness. St. Paul refers to members of his early communities as "the saints". For me, the thought is both inviting and intimidating. So I look for encouragement. One of my favorite quotes about sanctity comes from an old (c. 1963) book Sanctity in Other Words by Hubert Von Zeller: "God is the only person who knows how your prayer is getting on, so why fuss? God is the only person who can judge what sort of the character who have really got, so why look into yourself and get discouraged and put on an act? God is the only person who can tell how far you have got in the journey towards him, so why try to measure the distance and put in little flags to show that you're making the grade? Leave all that to God-in trust."

Another "oldie but goodie" Gerald Vann wrote: "The Christian life is too often painted for us by moralists and preachers who are purely prosaic, and perhaps even prosy, and that is a great tragedy because it is a distortion. Present

in terms merely of character training, of acquiring the moral virtues, and you deChristianize it, for there is nothing specifically Christian about being prudent and just and brave and self controlled. The Christian ideal at which we have to aim, however remotely, is not just virtuous conduct but holiness, and holiness means being possessed by the spirit: the wind that blows where it will, and no man knows where it comes from or where it goes. That is the poetry of the Christian life. And that is why the Saints are so exciting, so spontaneous, so unpredictable; for they are what we all ought to be, the troubadours of God."
