PASTOR'S CORNER

"Why does it seem like we "run out" of hosts sometimes at Sunday Mass?" Periodically, I'm asked this question, or one like it. I think another way to ask the question is, "Why don't we use the hosts from the tabernacle right away? Aren't they there as a 'reserve'?"

The "General Instruction of the Roman Missal" (the official instructions how to celebrate the Mass) states:

It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the instances when it is permitted, they partake of the chalice (cf. below, no. 283), so that even by means of the signs Communion will stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated.

So what we are doing is making an effort that as many

people as possible receive Holy Communion from hosts consecrated at the Mass they are celebrating. It may not be the most efficient, but it expresses a deep truth. That truth is that in Holy Communion we are receiving the fruit of THIS renewal of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

Another reason for this directive comes to us from 1 Corinthians where Paul proclaims, "We, many though we are, are one body for we all partake of the one bread." In other words, even though at Sunday Mass we do not break one very large piece of bread for everyone, but use individual hosts; using only hosts consecrated at that Mass helps preserve something of the Spirit of Paul's admonition. Understanding Holy Communion as a private act impoverishes it.

While this may not be the most efficient way to celebrate the Communion Rite, it is the way the Church encourages us to celebrate it.

Haiti Donations:

On January 24, 2010, President Obama signed into law legislation allowing donations for the Haiti Earthquake relief to be deducted as a contribution for 2009. Cash donations to charities for the Haitian relief effort given after January 11 and before March 1 of this year may be treated as if the contribution were made on December 31 of last year so the contribution can be deducted from 2009 income.
