The Parish Pastoral Council wants to hear from you.

Almost a year ago we re-formed the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). The primary responsibility of the PPC is pastoral planning. Since then we have been meeting monthly. We've been looking at what the Church suggests in its documents are the elements of parish life. We've discussed how we should go about reinforcing those elements that now exist and how to address those yet unmet.



Obviously, twelve people sitting around a table cannot capture all that a Parish has to say about its hopes and dreams for the future. It is clear to us that we cannot go forward without hearing from the parishioners of St. Julie Billiart. Since this is a spiritual endeavor and not a business one, the questions we ask flow from the Mission of Jesus and our identity as a Catholic Parish. They will be questions like the following:

- If Jesus were here today, what words would he give us to direct our future?
- How should we take into account the guidance of the Universal Church? Of the Archdiocese?
- What makes our parish unique and special?
- What makes you most proud to be a member of St. Julie Billiart Catholic Church?
- What do you expect of your parish?
- How can you help our Parish better fulfill the Mission of Jesus?
- What do our demographics and data suggest that we do for the future?

PPC is working with a facilitator to design a "listening session" in which parishioners will speak with each other and to the PPC. The meeting will be on Tuesday evening September 6 from 7:30 to 9:00 pm.

While not all school children are looking forward to school resuming, we know how important education is for them. Continued learning and advanced training is important for adults too. Unfortunately, not all people around the world have access to education. According to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, only half the children of Haiti routinely attend primary school. Only 35% of the children who begin primary school in Mozambique finish. 26% of girls, age 15 – 24, in India are illiterate.

St. Julie Billiart Parish Financial Report July 2010 - June 2011

Enclosed in this bulletin is our July 2010 – June 2011 yearly financial report. You will also find a financial report for the Hispanic Ministry of Hamilton and the St. Vincent DePaul Society which both function at our our parish but are both separately funded. A few notes about the report:

Actual July 2010 - June 2011:

We operated in the black this year! Thanks to all who continue to financially support our parish to make this happen.

Our collections exceeded our budgeted goal. Our parish members responded positively when we ran our increased parish support program in the Fall of 2010. Our average weekly collection is up about 6.5% from the previous fiscal year. Bingo proceeds surpassed the projected goal of \$50,000.00 by \$10,000.00. Thanks to all who keep this important fundraiser operating.

Looking at the expense section of the budget, we ended up over budget, but we completed some much needed maintenance to our church building and to our Fenmont Center. Here's what we accomplished this year:

- Church Building:
 - Brick and mortar repair and weather sealing the surface,
 - Repair of slate roof, new control system for HVAC system and
 - Concrete work on Dayton Street.
- Fenmont Building: St. Julie Hall – new drop ceiling and lighting.

Looking at our budget for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, again we project to operate in the black.

Financial matters are not the only measure of stewardship by our members. The Time and Talent that our members give to the parish are equally important. We are blessed to have members who respond to our call to assist in all aspects of parish life such as: Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Servers, Greeters, Music Ministry, Sacramental Preparation Teams, St. Julie Credit Union, St. Vincent De Paul Society, PREP teachers, Altar Rosary Society, ACES, Ministers of Praise, Young Family Small Group, Bingo/Concession workers, and our newly formed Heavenly Kitchen, which will expand our Bereavement Committee by offering a luncheon for the family and friends of the deceased. Other members serve on parish committees like Pastoral Council, Finance, Outreach, Spiritual Life, and Hospitality. Wow, we have a lot of things happening in our parish! Keep a look out in the bulletins for the many ways that we as a parish strive to share and grow in our faith.

What can you do to help our parish continue to share and grow in our faith?

- Get involved –all of our ministries can use new members and ideas.
- Attend the various programs offered by our parish.

Prayerfully consider to maintain or increase your current level of financial support to our parish.

Something that you don't see on our financial report is that our parish members donated over \$44,000.00 to support our neighbors in need through various special collections, the Make a Change Projects and the Catholic Ministry Appeal.

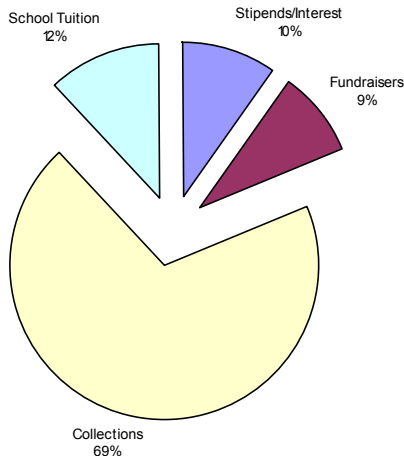

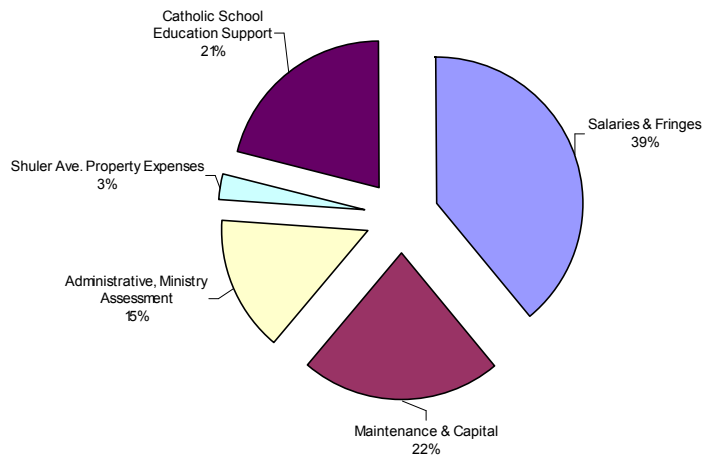

### What is RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation — Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a “spiritual journey.” Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church’s way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

### Who is RCIA for?

1. Persons in need of Baptism.
2. Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic.
3. Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

### What are Inquiry Sessions?

Inquiry Sessions, also known as Precatechumenate Sessions, are the first step in the RCIA process. These sessions are held for

people who want to find out more about the Catholic faith. These people come from all walks of life. They might not be baptized. They might have been baptized in another Christian church. They might have been baptized Catholic as a baby or young child but don’t know anything else about being Catholic. They have questions and they have a story to share. They are searching for the right path to follow on their faith journey. The Inquiry Sessions help inquirers to find what they are looking for, while faithfully and constantly proclaiming the living God and Jesus Christ whom God as sent for the salvation of all. (RCIA 36) Inquiry Sessions are held year-round to welcome those who have questions and want to find out more when they are ready.
