## PASTOR'S CORNER

Today is Catechetical Sunday. In addition to a special recognition of catechists at 11:00 Mass, our new high school catechist, Anita Lukey, will be saying a few words at all the Masses. Last week we introduced her at the 1:00 Mass. I've known Anita for most of her life (that makes me old and her young). As you may have read in the *St. Julie's Jewels*, Anita is a graduate of the University of Dayton and worked with a Marianist program for Catholic elementary school teachers in San Antonio. She speaks both English and Spanish.

Anita will begin on Sunday mornings with our young people who attend public high schools. As the year unfolds, we will probably add activities at other times for all high school students.

We celebrated the feast of the Assumption at 12:05 pm on August 15. We had a good attendance. Since

over the years folks have asked about the possibility of a weekly noon Mass, I took a quick show of hands. A good number of those present said that they would attend a noon Mass. On the other hand, only a few "regulars" at 8:00 am Mass said they could not attend at noon. **So, beginning Monday, October 3 Monday Mass will be celebrated at 12:05 pm every week rather than at 8:00 am.**

We'll learn a section at a time during September, with the music ministers filling in until we know the whole hymn.
