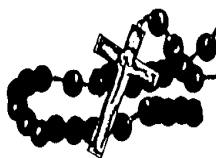
OCT 2nd- Parent Meeting for those who have children making their first Reconciliation. The meeting will take place in the parish office at 10 a.m.
