## PASTOR'S CORNER

I'm taking the easy way out on my "corner" this weekend. Fr. Ron Haft, Pastor of St. Peter in Chains Parish, recently sent a letter out to all parishioners. I thought I'd include a bit of it here.

*It is my duty as a pastor to be concerned for every soul in our parish territory. So, I want to encourage everyone regarding the importance of Sunday Mass participation... The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us about the Third Commandment "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy." Accordingly, the precept of the church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely: "On Sundays and other Holy Days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass. The precept of participating in the Mass is satisfied by assistance at a Mass which is celebrated anywhere in a catholic rite either on the holy day or on the evening of the preceding day."...*

*Participating at Sunday Mass is a virtue while skipping Sunday Mass is a sin. The exception is of course for serious illness or a family emergency, not golf, football or soccer. Thank goodness sins can be forgiven through the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).*

*I'm sure that as some people read this letter you may recall that someone said at one time or another "You don't have to go to Mass on Sundays to be a good catholic, or going during the week substitutes for Sunday." This is simply wrong and has misled people. Others may still be upset because of the recent scandal with the priests and some bishops. Yes, the scandal happened and it was wrong. But do not let the sins of some stand between you and your relationship with Jesus Christ.*
