## PASTOR'S CORNER

My life, like your's most probably, is filled with good intentions that are never quite realized. Now that we are celebrating Monday Mass at 12:05, we are saying the Angelus when the bells ring before Mass at noon. If I were more disciplined I'd do that every day.

The Angelus is a prayer to Mary that can be prayed three times a day. Monks go to chapel for morning, noonday, and evening prayer (traditionally 6:00 am, noon, 6:00 pm). In the middle ages the peasants were often illiterate and, even if they could read, were not able to come in from the fields as the monks did. So they literally dropped what they were doing and prayed this simple Biblically-themed prayer. Jean-Francois Millet captured the meaning in his painting "The Angelus" [http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/File:Jean-Fran%C3%A7ois\\_Millet\\_\(II\)\\_001.jpg](http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/File:Jean-Fran%C3%A7ois_Millet_(II)_001.jpg)

The beauty of this custom is that the holy breaks into our day so as to sanctify it. You can listen for bells or set your electronic device (there are apps available). Holy people

remind me that, as I struggle to be a person of prayer, in the beginning it is not so much the length of prayer as much as its frequency and discipline. Praying the Angelus three times a day is a way of introducing some discipline.

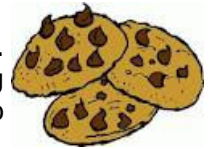

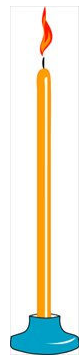


Please consider joining the Young Family Small Group if you are a member of the parish who are the parents of infants, toddlers, or children in early elementary school for our fall events! We will be

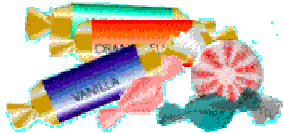
### Restore, Renew, Replenish at the Celebration of Caregivers.
