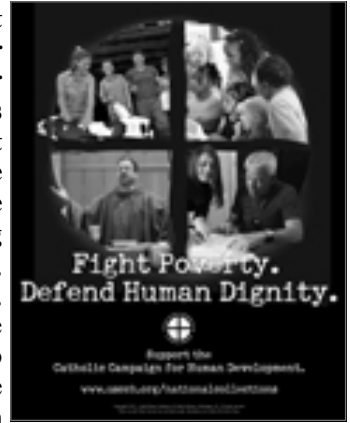

**REPORTING ABUSE IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CINCINNATI**

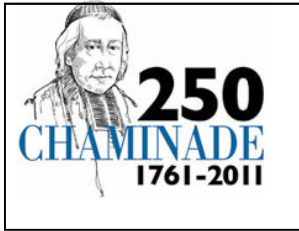
