## PASTOR'S CORNER

The new translation of the Roman Missal will be introduced at Masses on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27. In a sense we are trying to "make something of this". We hope that the change of language will help us:

- Stop to think about what we are saying or singing
- Help us balance the "closeness" of God with the "bigness" of God. His transcendence.

Get more in touch with the long tradition of the Mass which is one of our treasures as Catholics.

To help with that, beginning this weekend, in the homily I will be highlighting different parts of the Mass. "Transition", for me, is the operative word in the **Introductory Rites**. We enter into a beautiful space that cannot be mistaken for anything other than a church. We gather with a group of people who do not gather together for any thing other than the Mass. We prepare ourselves to encounter the Risen Lord in this gathering, in the actions of the priest, in the scriptures, and in the Body and Blood of the Glorified Lord. The **Introductory Rites** help us make

that transition. The beauty of this part of the Mass is that it "works" without us even being aware.

The new translation of the **Profession of Faith** or **Creed** contains some new words some of which bear explanation. I'm doing that this weekend. In many things in life we are careful about the words we use; from writing a contract to asking for forgiveness from someone I've offended. The older English translation of the **Creed** was not "inaccurate" but could be more precise. That is one of the reasons for the new translation.

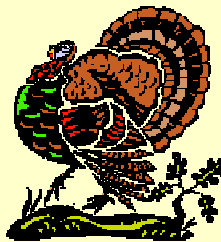
